

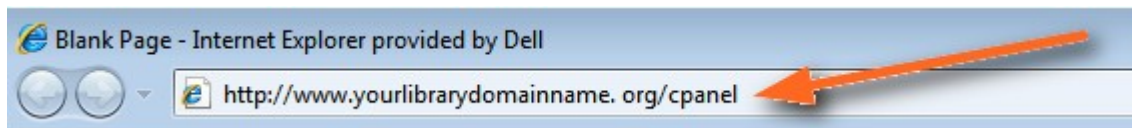
Instructions for Checking Web Statistics for your NCLD Web site

These instructions include the following sections:

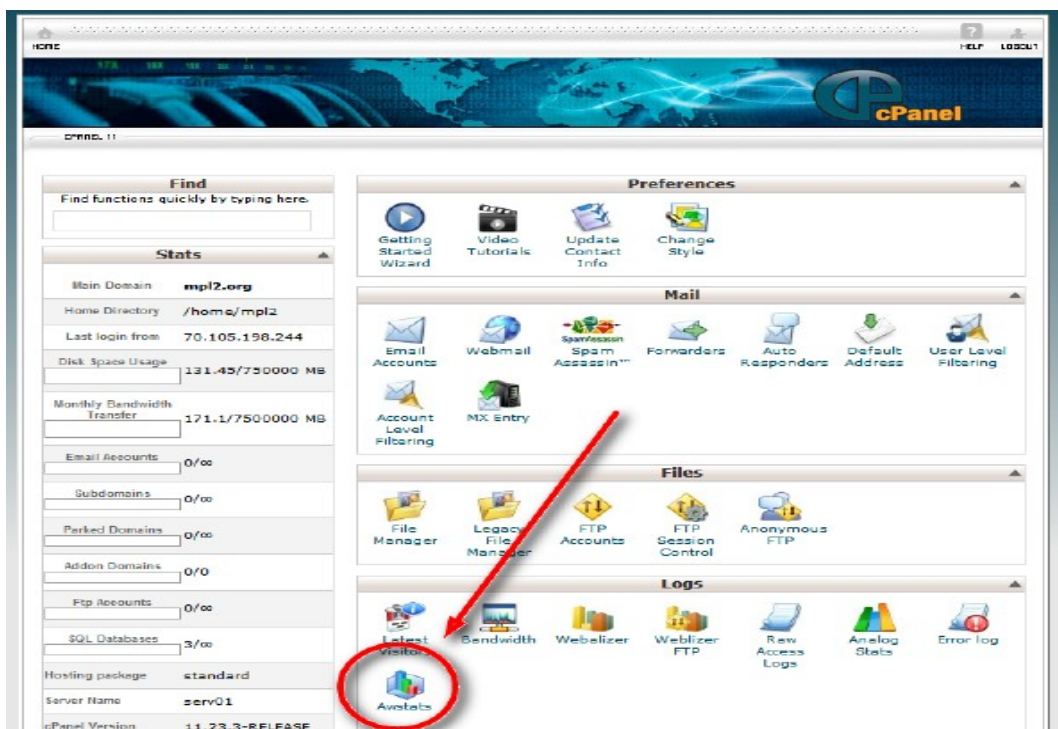
- How to log-in to cPanel for your library website.
- How view the web statistics for your library.

How to login to cPanel

1. Using a web browser - Internet Explorer or Firefox, browse to your library website and then add the following to your web address: **/cpanel** at the end of your library **URL** as shown in the example below: The easiest way to do this is to just go to your website and then type **/cpanel** at the end



2. Press the enter key and you'll be prompted for your username and password. If a message pops up about accepting a security certificate or error, then just click OK or yes.
3. If a message pops up or a page appears about accepting a security certificate or error, then just click **OK** or **yes** or **continue**.
4. Enter your username and password and click on "**OK**". This is the same username and password that is used to login to edit your website.



5. When the **CPanel** home page appears as shown above, click on the **AWstats** icon, in the Logs section as shown below.

6. Click on the **View** magnifying glass icon

Select a Domain



This will open up a page that graphically displays your web site statistics (**as shown below**) about how many users have accessed your web site during a certain period of time. You can select the month or year, you want to display. You can examine other statistics by clicking the items in the left column. Click the "Update Now" link to get the latest up to the minute numbers.


The **Summary** section creates a table of statistics, here are what those numbers mean.

What do these numbers mean?

- **Unique visits:** is the total individual computers that visited the web site. A record of each unique computer address is added to the server log when that computer returns it is NOT recounted. A user(s) computer is recorded once per month.
- **Total number of visits:** Exact number of visits made to the site. This is the best indicator of the amount of people on the web site.
- **Total number of pages viewed:** The exact number of web pages viewed.. This shows how many pages viewed by people on site..
- **Average # of pages viewed per visit:** The more pages viewed per visit the higher the number and the better.
